How did some lay groups of Christians try to better their society through their faith and devotion to their ideals.

Overview the major peasant revolts of the Middle Ages. Detailing the differences between the two major revolts. (Jacquerie and English Peasants Revolt)

Summarize the impact of Capitalism and the Guild System in Europe during the Middle Ages.

Discuss the patterns of marriage, prostitution and legal view points of sex in the Middle Ages.

Explain the concept of and reasons for Fur Collar Crime.

Discuss the attitudes towards different ethnic groups and restrictions on them.

Discuss the view points of race and blood during the Medieval Period.

Describe the impact of the Humanist movement and its core beliefs in pushing the Renaissance forward.

Explain the idea of a Humanist education citing examples from the text. (long section)

Evaluate the message in Machiavelli's *The Prince* and the lessons to be learned by a ruler.

Discuss how the Secularist movement was part of Renaissance Society.

Although it seems they would be at odds, Humanism and Christianity converged in the Christian Humanist movement, explain their core beliefs.

Describe the important lessons to be learned by *Utopia* and compare it with Machiavelli's *The Prince*.

What impact did Erasmus have on the Northern Renaissance and the Church itself.
