Elk Ridge kicked off their reading initiative on Monday with a visit from the Lancaster Barnstormers baseball team's mascot, Cylo.

During the rest of March, Elk Ridge students and staff are looking forward to Agricultural Literature Day and Poison Prevention Presentations.

Nottingham Students, Staff and Faculty celebrated Random Acts of Kindness during the Week of February 14 - February 18, 2022. Each day was assigned a kindness theme in which students participated by dressing for the theme of the day.

Members of the National Honor Society are currently getting ready for a Dance Marathon. Students will be collecting money to help fund research for childhood cancer. Members who register for the marathon will dance for the kids on April 1, 2022.

Widener University presented Tim Lamb with the High School Leadership Award on March 31, 2022. This award embodies Widener University's commitment to develop and inspire leaders to affect positive change.

Mr. Woods relinquished his time to Jordan Bank Principal, Dr. David Hamburg and Elk Ridge Principal, Mr. Matthew Hovanec who presented their school's grade span reports.

REPORT OF SCHOOL PROGRAMS

Dr. Hamburg outlined the Early Intervention program at Jordan Bank and working together with the CCIU and local pre-schools, so students are comfortable and ready to enter kindergarten. Jordan Bank utilizes the School-Wide Positive Behavior Program, which emphasizes respect, responsibility, honesty, effort, and kindness.

Student growth is supported using the Multi-Tiered System of Support (MTSS) along with fun instructional activities like 100th day of school projects and dress fancy days.

Mr. Hovanec outlined Elk Ridge's School Wide Positive Behavior Program. Much like Jordan Banks, it encourages positive behavior in the school and students receive incentives and recognition for themselves and their classroom hive.

Elk Ridge implements the MTSS model and utilizes technology to deliver lessons and strengthen academic skills. Through fun activities such as Mobile Ag Lab, Read Across America Day and Literacy Spirit Week to planting new garden beds, fieldtrips to the Zoo, reading with the Lancaster Barnstormers, and tracking medals won at the Olympics, Elk Ridge's attention is on the individual student and promoting life-long learning.

RECOGNITION OF PERSONS WHO REQUESTED TO THE AGENDA

Dolores Wiker-Presented a letter of intent to file a claim against the Boards liability policy. She proposes that the school board has conspired to withhold records she has requested and claims the board is guilty of criminal conspiracy. Claims the Board is in violation of many, state international and federal laws. Her goal is to "free our children from the tyranny imposed by the board, local, state and federal government."

Jill Gallagher, East Nottingham Township read a letter from a community member who wanted to speak but remain anonymous. Letter was in support of mental health services through the school.

Ronnie Lutz, East Nottingham Township-presented letters to the board. Feels that the board violated 13 state, federal and international codes, and did not engage stockholders prior to the presentation of the ESSER Health and Safety Plan.

Judy Martorano-Feels students are being used for political warfare.

Carol Colangelo-Presented letters to the Board.

Doug Henderson-East Nottingham Township. Spoke about ESSER survey, controversy over test scores.

Robert Williams-Drug Safety Scientist, people are addicted to their 5 min of fame and are talking nonsense. Parents need to set a better example.

Raul Toledo-Spoke through a translator, responded to racist statements. Regardless of race, all students are entitled to an education when they come to this country.

Christina Stevens- Upper Oxford Township Addressed Mr. Blessington's social media posts showing support of white supremacy, lack of respect for teachers and asked for him to resign.

Meghan Street-Oxford Borough-responded to Mrs. Kehs comments.

Jessica Bird-Oxford Graduate-feels children are no longer a priority for some board members. Stated that the objections to the Health and Safety plan prevent the district from putting children first.

Vicki Bolger-Lower Oxford Township-Commented on Mr. Blessington's social media posts and his responses to her emails. Asked for Kehs and Blessington's resignation.

Sarah Thomas-Oxford Borough West-responded to Mrs. Kehs comments.
