

Technology

Jordan Bank Media Center is fortunate to have an Interactive White Board. This is a fun and engaging way for children to be introduced to learning tools in the 21st century. We frequently use Discovery School United Streaming Video to enhance curriculum, on-line data bases, such as Pebble Go for research skills, Tumble Books for interactive read-alouds, and a variety of other age appropriate, previewed websites. We compliment library instruction with mini Ipads.



Important Information

Jordan Bank Media Center houses over 5000 books and materials of instruction for the students. In order to keep the collection current and in circulation for your children and future children of Jordan Bank we ask that the parents share in the responsibility of taking care of your child's library book. A permission slip with book care tips will be sent home in October, after your child has been taught proper book care. This permission slip is acknowledging that should a book become lost or damaged during the school year, you will be financially responsible for the replacement cost.

Book Fair

Jordan Bank Media Center will host two book fairs this school year. Scholastic Book Fairs are a primary fundraiser for the Library-Media Center. Our first book fair will be
